

AUTHOR'S NOTE



I have lived around Herdsman Lake for the entire duration of my second life in Australia. Despite changing home multiple times I have never really left the Wembley area. The lakeside has been a constant destination for evening strolls, bike rides and contemplation of nature. Living around the lake is a constant source of surprise and peace. Quieter and less feisty than the mighty ocean, Herdsman Lake is home to a diverse flora and fauna, myself included.

The piece can be performed using the provided field recording of Herdsman Lake. Alternatively, I have included some effects at the beginning of "Part 2: Ripples" that might help recreate the acoustic environment of the lake.

Part 1: Slow Flight on a distance

The slap emulates sound and movement of a heron flapping its wings.

Part 2: Ripples

This movement depicts the play of light and the water ripples in musical form.

At the beginning the circles are clear and perfectly circular, then they suddenly start bouncing thorough their movement rebounded by the lake's coast: this creates irregular and faster moving waves (e.g. bar 16).
